We reply to your request for clarifications on the news article entitled "Gov't suspends Berong nickel operations in Palawan" posted in Manila Bulletin (Internet Edition) on July 18, 2016. The article reported in part that:

"The Philippines has suspended a third nickel mine in less than two weeks and again warned miners not to violate environmental laws, the cabinet secretary overseeing mining told a radio station.

Regina Lopez, secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), told the Manila station DZMM on Saturday a suspension order was slapped on Friday on Berong Nickel Corp's mine in Palawan because of a spill that affected corals.

Gentlemen:

This has reference to the news article entitled "Gov't Suspends Berong Nickel Operations in Palawan" posted online by Manila Bulletin last 18 July 2016. We understand that the Philippine Stock Exchange has requested clarification on the matter.

First of all, as early as 24 June 2016, Berong Nickel Corporation (BNC) had discontinued its mining and hauling operations due to the unusual and intermittent rains for fourteen (14) successive days. This is a company protocol observed during such circumstances to enable the company to fully concentrate its efforts in addressing potential environmental concerns that are expected from undue weather condition and La Nina phenomenon. The voluntary suspension was made prior to BNC's receipt of the suspension order dated 28 June 2016 issued by the Mines Geosciences Bureau – Region IV B Office (MGB Region Office).

MGB Region Office cited the alleged discoloration of the Liabongan River that was noted during the heavy rains last 23 June 2016 as ground for the suspension. However, to clarify, the discoloration can be attributed to the surface run-off, which is a natural occurrence expected from the intermittent rains for fourteen (14) successive days.

Rest assured that all of BNC's environmental structures are intact, and BNC is continuing all efforts to reinforce its systems to address similar situations in the future. Further to its commitment to protect the environment, and as a responsible miner, BNC had also

coordinated with the appropriate agencies for compliance with regulations and the eventual lifting of the suspension.
